1. Was the deceased in the process of escaping from the Maze Prison when he was shot after having exited compound 5 via a tunnel dug by those who were held in that compound?

Two shots

Second shot
8. What warnings, if any, were issued before the first shot?
General warning given. Directed to all.

9. If you conclude there were two shots, what warnings, if any, were issued before the second shot?
No verbal warning given.
10. Did the shooter see something shining/reflecting in the light before the first shot was fired?
No
11. If you conclude a second shot was fired, did the shooter see something shining/reflecting in the light before the second shot was fired?
No
12. Was the deceased armed at the time he was shot?
No
13. What position/posture was the deceased in when he was shot?
Crawling forward, away from HM Prison Maze

14. What was the deceased doing immediately prior to his death?
Waiting to continue through passage of wire
15. Was the entry wound in the deceased's lower right back (chest) as described by Dr Carson and Professor Crane?
